Always read the fine print, and consider the consequences of your actions before agreeing to anything.

When traveling, it is always best to minimize use of your debit card. Take a reasonable amount of cash to use for small dollar purchases and use a credit card for larger ones. This gives you more protection and allows you to dispute unauthorized charges without them actually hitting your bank account and hard earned money.

Be mindful of public WIFI while traveling. You never know what scammer is also on the public WIFI trying to steal your information.
